The Deakin Residents Association will be holding their Annual General Meeting at the Bridge Club, Duff Street, Deakin on 20th November at 6:30pm.

The DRA is honoured to have Chris Steel MLA (Minister for Transport and City Services; Community Services and Facilities; Multicultural Affairs; ACT Government and Canberra) attending as the guest speaker. He has undertaken to talk on topics of particular interest to members of the DRA. These include the Light Rail proposal, the potential impact on existing bus services and travel times between Woden and Civic.

DRA has submitted an application for support under the Adopt a Park program that seeks to facilitate the formation of a volunteer group within the DRA in the upkeep and maintenance of La Trobe Park. It is hoped that the funding will lead to increased community use of the park; and contribute to the enhancement of Canberra's reputation as a 'garden city'.

Griffith Narrabundah Community Association

The Griffith Narrabundah Community Association (GNCA) is committed to improving the amenity of Manuka Village.

In June the GNCA wrote to Chief Minister Andrew Barr about repairing unsafe paved areas and footpaths, removing graffiti, remediating areas prone to local flooding, possibly converting part of Franklin Street to a shared car and pedestrian zone, providing and maintaining more litter bins and new seating in Captain Cook Park, and revamping Palmerston Lane.

The Chief Minister has responded positively.

Consideration will be given to removing graffiti on

Endeavour House (with a possible community mural

replacement), relaying pavers and reducing trip hazards, a review of litter bins and park benches, and a shared traffic zone on Franklin Street between Furneaux Street and Flinders Way.

The Chief Minister also encouraged Manuka businesses to put a proposal together to indicate preferences and related costs for upgrading Palmerston Lane. GNCA has established a dialogue with the Manuka Business Association with a view to future collaboration, including following up on the correspondence with the Chief Minister.

The Kingston and Barton Residents Group (KBRG) will hold their Annual General Meeting on 26 November at 6.30 pm. All residents within the KBRG area will be notified by post.

The Kingston and Barton area continues to see significant growth and development, bringing new life and energy to the area. The most significant development still to come is the Kingston Arts Precinct.



The final design for the Precinct is currently being refined with input being sought from the local community, arts groups, businesses and more broadly across Canberra. The KBRG will continue to seek input from local residents to feed into this process.

Our focus for 2020 includes the Kingston Arts Precinct, activation of the Kingston Shops and a proposal to 'adopt' Telopea Park.

The Red Hill flats redevelopment has recommenced after challenges with bonded asbestos on site, and the first Development Applications for townhouses and apartments have been submitted. Construction on the old Morling Lodge site in Hicks Street also commenced early in October.

The Integrated Plan for the Red Hill Nature Reserve and Surrounds (Federal Golf Course) has been released for comment, with improvement from a Red Hill perspective. The original plan of having the development entry on Gowrie Drive had safety concerns (access and increased traffic).

Old Narrabundah Community Council Inc



The YRA has been very active throughout the year in trying to maintain and improve the amenity of the suburb.

We have a volunteer tree maintenance group working in conjunction with the ACT Government. In recent years the YRA successfully applied for 4 grants from the Commonwealth Government to co-fund 4 park benches, 2 defibrillators and the drinking fountain at the Yarralumla shops.

The YRA is once again hosting Yarralumla Does Christmas 2019 in Weston Park on Saturday December 7 (5.00 pm to 7.30 pm). BYO Picnic- all invited.

For many years the YRA has focused attention on the development of the Brickworks site. The contract between the developer Doma and the Suburban Land Agency (SLA) was signed on 24 September 2019, followed by a presentation in late October. The YRA continues to advocate for the community in seeking the best possible outcome.

The YRA has held discussions with the National Capital Authority and ACT Environment and Planning to try to revive plans to turn two storm water drains flowing into Lake Burley Griffin into a Yarralumla Wetlands area.
