

## Heritage

### ISCCC Planning Meeting - 7 February 2023 - Sue Tongue

1. What makes the Inner South special? That is what the District Strategy is supposed to capture.
2. It is heritage – environmental and the built environment.
3. The built heritage is not just what is on the Heritage Register and in the Heritage Precincts – that is what Anne will talk about.
4. It is in the streets. It is the Inner South vibe.
5. The Inner North and Inner South reflect the Garden City Movement. We are the stewards of the legacy of the Griffin, Sulman and Weston.
6. This is embedded in the streetscapes and character. The trees, the setbacks, the space, the built form...
7. I don't need to explain to you the importance of heritage – the social, economic and wellbeing advantages. UNESCO has done a lot of work on this.
8. If you look at the District Strategy you find heritage in the Green Blue Network. Look carefully. Look at the targets and implementation pathways. It is mainly about the natural environment. Sometimes the Heritage register places and precincts are mentioned but rarely.
9. There are 27 hits on heritage when you word search the District Strategy. You will see the natural environment often. Look hard for where it protects what the ISCCC talked about in its District Strategy.
10. My suggestion is to look closely at the definitions in the draft Act and other documents. When you read "heritage" dig deeper. Think practically about what you would use in the new planning laws to protect what is valuable in your community. What should be changed to protect our heritage? It is a new challenge!
